

New SSAT Classes

Dear parents and students,

Meritus Academy will open three new SSAT courses from December 3, 2023 to June 16, 2024.

The Secondary School Admission Test (SSAT) is an admission test that's used by private or independent schools in the U.S. and Canada to evaluate an applicant for admission. This test consists of quantitative (mathematics), verbal (vocabulary), reading, and writing sections. The writing section does not count toward the test's final score. It is used by the school's admission officer as a reference only. Our new SSAT courses only teach the verbal (vocabulary), reading, and writing sections.

The SSAT is separated into three levels: The Upper Level is for students currently in Grades 8-11 applying for grades 9-12; the Middle Level is for students currently in Grades 5-7 applying for grades 6-8; and the Elementary Level is for students currently in Grades 3-4 applying for grades 4-5.

Starting this year, some schools have made SSAT optional for private school applications. However, submitting the SSAT score will still benefit the applicant. Our SSAT courses not only prepare students for the exam, but also improve their language abilities, which will greatly help their studies in private schools and U.S. top university admissions in the future.

Each course contains 26 classes in total. Each class is two hours long and will be held once a week.

Below is the detailed schedule for these classes:

Course Name	Schedule
SSAT Middle Level - 1 (Grade 5-7) (In-person)	Starting from December 3, every Sunday at 12:00 - 2:00 PM
SSAT Middle Level - 2 (Grade 5-7) (Online)	Starting from December 6, every Wednesday at 6:45 - 8:45 PM
SSAT Upper Level (Grade 8-11) (Online)	Starting from December 3, every Sunday at 12:00 - 2:00 PM

Note: The course content is the same for both SSAT Middle Level - 1 & 2. They are held at different time slots. Students can choose either one of them.
